OBJAVLJEN TRIDESET PETI MONITORING IZVEŠTAJ O MEDIJSKOJ SCENI SRBIJE  
za jul 2012!**

U ovom Izveštaju, između ostalog, možete pročitati više o:

- povredama **slobode izražavanja** u slučaju verbalnog i fizičkog napada na novinara i snimatelja RTV kao i u slučaju izbacivanja novinarke sa sednice Opštinskog veća u Ljigu; o sudskim postupcima, u okviru čega su analizirana 4 slučaja koja su se desila u ovom periodu i koji, svaki na svoj način, govore o praksi sudova u Srbiji;
- **implementaciji postojećih propisa** – *Zakon o radiodifuziji* – primena zakona se prati u kontekstu formiranja liste kandidata za članove Programskog odbora Radiodifuzne ustanove Vojvodine; *Zakon o zaštiti podataka o ličnosti i Zakon o elektronskim komunikacijama* – Izveštaj obrađuje rezultate nadzora nad primenom zakona kod operatora telefonije u Srbiji i preporuke za unapređenje stanja, koje su sastavili Poverenik za informacije od javnog značaja i zaštitu podataka o ličnosti i Zaštitnik građana;
- **usvajanju novih zakona** – monitoring tim piše o novom Zakonu o ministarstvima kojim je predviđena drugačija raspodela nadležnosti za određena pitanja od značaja za medijski sektor – nadležnosti dosadašnjeg objedinjenog Ministarstva kulture, informisanja i informacionog društva, sada su podeljene između Ministarstva kulture i informisanja, sa jedne strane, i Ministarstva spoljne i unutrašnje trgovine i telekomunikacija, sa druge;
- **radu nadležnih organa** – u ovom delu izveštaja autori analiziraju: odluke Republičke radiodifuzne agencije (RRA) o oduzimanju dozvole za emitovanje programa pre isteka vremena na koje su izdate; godišnji pregled tržišta telekomunikacija u Republici Srbiji za 2011. godinu koji je objavila Republička agencija za elektronske komunikacije (RATEL) s posebnim osvrtom na radio pirateriju; jednu odluku Komisije za žalbe Saveta za štampu, objavljenu u ovom periodu; nova kadrovska rešenja u Vladi Republike Srbije, konkretno imenovanja ministara u ministarstvima posebno značajnim za medijski sektor; nastavak pregovora sa organizacijama za kolektivnu zaštitu autorskog i srodnih prava, koji bi trebalo da dovedu do sporazuma o popustima koji bi se primenjivali na važeću tarifu Sokoja;
- **procesu digitalizacije** – Izveštaj se bavi pitanjima sertifikacije opreme, STB uređaja i TV aparata, za prijem digitalnog signala, u kontekstu najave JP „Emisiona tehnika i veze“ da će izdavati nalepnice kojima garantuje podobnost opreme za prijem DVB-T2 signala;
- **privatizaciji medija** – šta su mogući razlozi za zabrinutost nove vlasti što 50% već privatizovanog udela u Politici, prelazi iz vlasništva jedne strane privatne kompanije u vlasništvo druge strane privatne kompanije;
- **u zaključku** – autori daju mišljenje i ocenu o tome šta nova vlada treba da učini kako bi se medijski sektor reformisao na način koji će garantovati medijski pluralizam i medijske slobode u Srbiji.

**THIRTY-FIFTH MONITORING REPORT ON THE SERBIAN MEDIA SCENE  
For July 2012  
NOW AVAILABLE ON ANEM WEBSITE!**

In this Report, among other things, you can read more about:

- violation of **freedom of expression**, in the case of verbal and physical attack on journalist and cameraman, as well as in the case of forcing a journalist to leave from the meeting of the Municipal Council in Ljig; court proceedings during this period - 4 cases that are analyzed, each in their own way, describe the practice of the courts in Serbia;
- **implementation of existing laws** – the Broadcasting Law – application of the law is monitored in the context of forming a list of candidates for members to the Programming Committee of the Public Service Broadcasting Institution of Vojvodina; the *Law on Personal Data Protection* and the *Law on Electronic Communications* – the Report deals with the results of oversight of the application of the law to telephone operators in Serbia and recommendations for improvements of the situation, compiled by the Commissioner for Information of Public Importance and Personal Data Protection and the Ombudsman;
- the **adoption of new laws** – the monitoring team deals with the new Law on Ministries, which provides for a different division of competence for specific issues relevant to the media sector – the former unified competence of the Ministry of Culture, Media and Information Society, is now divided between the Ministry of Culture and Media, on one

hand, and the Ministry of Foreign and Domestic Trade and Telecommunications, on the other;

- the **work of the authorities** – in this part of the Report, the authors analyze: the decisions of the *Republic Broadcasting Agency* (RBA) to revoke the broadcasting license before their expiration of validity; the annual review of the telecommunications market in the Republic of Serbia in 2011, published by the *Republic Agency for Electronic Communications* (RATEL), with special reference to radio piracy; a decision of the *Press Council's Commission for Complaints*, brought in this period; a new personnel solutions of the *Government of the Republic of Serbia*, in particular, the appointment of ministers in ministries of specific importance for the media sector; continued negotiations with organizations for the *collective protection of copyright and related rights*, which should lead to an agreement about the discounts that will be applied to the applicable tariff of Sokoj;
- **digitalization process** – the Report addresses the issues of certification of equipment, set top boxes and TV sets for receiving digital signal, in the context of the announcement of the Public Company "Broadcasting Equipment and Communications" (ETV) that it will distribute labels guaranteeing the suitability of equipment for the reception of DVB-T2 signal;
- **privatization of media** – and possible reasons for concern of the new government that ownership of already privatized 50% share in the daily "Politika" is being passed from one foreign private company to another;
- In the **conclusion** – authors give their opinion and assessment of what the new government should do to reform the media sector in a way that will guarantee media pluralism and media freedom in Serbia.
